For: Chevrolet Tracker 1999 and newer

Do Not install this product on any vehicle other than the one listed above.




WARNING

Installation Tips

Part Number: 51366

Before you begin installing this top assembly, read all instructions thoroughly. After completing the installation, keep these instructions for further reference. Below are a few tips to make this installation easier.

For a smooth fit:

For ease in installation, the top should be installed at temperatures above 72° F. Below this temperature, the top may contract an inch or more, making it difficult to fit to the vehicle.

It is normal for a top to contract and wrinkle when stored in the shipping carton. Within a few days after the installation, the top will relax and the wrinkles will disappear.


Top Installation


Step One

Remove the old top. Set aside the two 7/64 Allen Bolts in the front center pillar retainer aside to be used in installing the Replacement Top (see Step Three) and the Rear Window Retainer Bar (see Step Eleven).


Step Two

Orient the Front Deck with the snaps toward the front of the vehicle and the vinyl side up. Turn the deck over and lay it vinyl side down on the center pillar of the vehicle with the plastic retainer strip toward the front. Locate the center notch in the strip and align it with the arrow marking the center of the retainer along the front edge of the center pillar. Slip the plastic strip into the channel on the retainer.


















To Release the Bow Assembly

To release the bow assembly, push the button on the bow release and pull the latch away from the bow.

To lock the bows into the upright position, close the latch against the bow until it locks into place.





Bow in Upright Position


Bow in Released Position

Step Nine


Make sure that the rear bow assembly is released and that the bow is in the released position.

Pull the rear legs of the deck down to the rear corners of the vehicle and locate the plastic strip sewn to the bottom of each leg. Slip the plastic into the corner retainer on the vehicle. The rear edge of the plastic should butt up against the stop on the retainer next to the tailgate opening and the front edge of the plastic should rest next to a pin in the retainer. If your vehicle does not have a pin in the retainer next to the front edge of the plastic strip, hook the plastic clip in the top over the edge of the retainer above the tailgate opening.

Lock the bows into the upright position.









Step Ten

Orient the Quarter Windows with the zipper toward the top and rear of the panel. Start the zipper at the top front corner and close it a few inches. Slip the plastic strip along the front and bottom of the panel into the retainer on the vehicle. Close the zipper to the rear corner of the panel. Make sure that the panel is seated into the retainer for a smooth fit. Tuck the top edge of the panel under the deck and fasten the hook and loop along the top and rear of the panel.





Note: The plastic strip along the front of the Quarter Window has a break-away notch. If your vehicle has a pin in the retainer that keeps the retainer from rolling into the channel, break out the notch and center it over the pin when setting the plastic strip into the retainer.



Step Eleven

Open the tailgate and orient the Rear Window with the zipper toward the top and the vinyl side out. Start the zipper on the passenger side of the vehicle and close it halfway to the other side. Slide the round channel in the Rear Window Retainer Bar onto the bottom edge of the window. Press the bar onto the ledge of the Rear Corner Retainers on each side of the tailgate opening. Close the zipper. Locate the loop flaps sewn on each side of the Rear Window, fold them over the ends of the zipper and fasten them to the hook sewn inside the top. Close the tailgate.







Care and Maintenance of your Bestop Top

Your top is made of the finest materials available. To keep it looking new and for the maximum possible wear, it will need periodic cleaning and maintenance.

Washing: The top fabric should be washed often using soap, warm water and a soft bristle brush. Rinse with clear water to remove all traces of soap.

Windows: Keep windows clean to avoid scratching. DO NOT use a brush on the windows! Wash with a watersoaked cloth or sponge and a mild dishwashing detergent. NEVER WIPE THE WINDOWS WHEN THEY ARE DRY. Be careful when cleaning snow or frost from the vinyl windows since they are easily scratched and may crack at low temperatures. DO NOT roll the sides or rear window in cold weather. The windows become stiff and will crack.

Zippers: Keeping the zipper cleaned and lubricated with a silicone lubricant will help prevent damage and keep the zippers in a smooth working condition. If a zipper opens behind the slider, the slider may have been spread apart. This problem can usually be repaired by using an ordinary pair of pliers to bring the sides

(sometimes broken)

back into parallel. Return slider to the end of the zipper in the normal Open position.

Squeeze lightly at first and test the zipper. If the zipper continues to remain open squeeze more firmly with the pliers and try the zipper again. Repeat this procedure until the zipper operates correctly.

Water: Seeping through at the seams may be stopped by applying 3-M Scotchgard® on the inside of the seams. Rips in the fabric may be repaired with Bondex® iron on patches. Iron the

patches to the Inside of the top, carefully following the Bondex® instructions.

Snaps: Keep snaps cleaned and lubricated with silicone to help prevent snaps from sticking to the studs. If a snap does become stuck to a stud, use a screwdriver and GENTLY pry apart to prevent permanent damage to the snap or the top fabric.
