

Measure center-to-center distance of frame rails. See the tables and figures below to determine which holes to use.






FISHWIRE TECHNIQUE


Insert coiled end of fishwire tool through hitch mounting hole in vehicle frame rail and out the access hole. Pass coiled end of fishwire through spacer and thread bolt into coil. Kink wire to keep spacer seperate from bolt as shown. Pull fishwire, spacer and bolt through frame and out mounting hole. Use fishwire to guide hitch during mounting and prevent loss of bolt or spacer inside frame rail.


Passenger side frame rail

INSTALLATION

Step 1

Measure center-to-center distance of frame rails. See the table and figures below to determine which holes to use.





For Frame Size	Use Holes
31" to 33 1/3"	One and four
35"	Two and four
37 1/2"	One and three
39"	One and three
41"	Two and three

Step 2

Some vehicles may have one or two holes in the frame to help locate the hitch. Use the hole(s) in the frame and drill holes A, B, C or D as recommended on the vehicle application listing on page 2.

On vehicles without frame holes, hold the hitch up to the frame using C-clamps, then mark and drill holes in the frame.

On some vehicles (mostly Ford) the frame may have a rivet which interfers with the installation. Remove the rivet and use the hole to bolt the hitch to the frame if desired or bolt to the frame using holes A, C and D.


On Chevy and GMC full-size vans, remove an discard the bumper bracket before installing hitch.

On Chevy and GMC mini-vans, place driver and passenger side frame rails between bumper bracket and frame.

For 1993 - 1997 Chevy Astro van, see diagram in next column.

Note: Installation of some models may be easier if spare tire is removed during installation. On Ford trucks, the spare tire bracket must be removed or adjusted before installing hitch.

Step 3

Bolt the driver side plate to the frame using 1/2" x 1 1/2" bolts (#5), flat washers (#6), lock washers (#3) and 1/2" nuts (#4), tighten firmly.

Step 4

Slide the main body assembly over the driver side plate insert. Slide the passenger side insert into the main body.

Note: Main body assembly can be reversed for use on Ford vans.

Step 5

Align the holes in driver side plate insert with the holes in the main body assembly and secure with 1/2" x 3 1/2" bolts (#2), lock washers (#3) and 1/2" nuts (#4).

Step 6

Align the holes in the passenger side plate insert with the holes in the main body assembly and secure with 1/2" x 3 1/2" bolts (#2), lock washers (#3) and 1/2" nuts (#4).

Step 7

Hold hitch up to frame and bolt passenger side plate to frame using 1/2" x 1 1/2" bolts (#5), flat washers (#6), lock washers (#3) and 1/2" nuts (#4).

Step 8

Torque all 1/2" fasteners to 110 lb-ft. To ensure proper installation, the driver side and passenger side insert tubes must be drawn together with the main body assembly tube to achieve metal-to-metal contact.
